- 2. With your partner, annotate the stanza, identifying any examples of the three sound devices, rhyme, alliteration and iambic pentameter that you can find.
- 3. Using the stanza above, or one you have selected for yourself, write a paragraph explaining the effect the sound devices have on you as a reader.

## **Language Devices:**

Alliteration: repeated starting sounds Rhyme: repeated ending sounds lambic Pentameter: a rhythm made of an 'unsress' followed by a 'stress' POINT: Name the effect you believe the device has
